SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER May 5th, 2024 ♣ 10:15 a.m.

This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's Gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And also with you.




God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.





UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Julian of Norwich, renewer of the church, died around 1416 Wednesday, May 8^{th}

When she was about thirty years old, Julian (or Juliana) reported visions that she later compiled into a book, Sixteen Revelations of Divine Love, now a classic of medieval mysticism. The visions declared that love was the meaning of religious experience, provided by Christ who is love, for the purpose of love.

Victor the Moor, martyr, died 303 (TFF) Wednesday, May 8th

Also known as Victor Maurus, this native of the northwest African nation of Mauritania was a soldier in the Roman Praetorian Guard. Under the persecution of Maximian, Victor died for his faith at Milan.

Nicolaus Ludwig von Zinzendorf, renewer of the church, hymnwriter, died 1760 Thursday, May 9th

When he was 22, a group of Moravians asked permission to live on Zinzendorf's land. He agreed, and eventually worldwide Moravian missions emanated from this community. Zinzendorf participated in these missions, and is also remembered for writing hymns characteristic of his Pietistic faith.

FREED TO CARE

A mother of a sick child went to sleep late into the night, after ceaseless hours of tending to her little one. As the night progressed, a train whistled by her home, motors crashing and crunching the sound of its presence. The mother didn't waken. The neighbor's radio sounded a wake-up call through an open window of the room in which she was sleeping. The mother didn't waken. An early morning thunderstorm rumbled in and out, growing in intensity and pressure with each passing moment. Still, the mother didn't waken.

But then: the child became restless and whimpered, his voice barely audible, weak. Instantly the mother awoke. Instantly, she moved to the side of his bed, beginning tending, calming, healing work.

Love one another, Jesus tells us. Love one another as attentively as a parent loves a child: watchfully, carefully, bringing into that care all the skills, gifts, and joy in his or her possession. Love one another, Jesus tells us, even as he, the Lord of life, has loved us.

We do not need to be consumed with worry over whether we are of any worth. Our lives are precious. We are held and kept in love that will not let us go. Christ has snatched us out of the web of all that works to destroy us—sin, death, the power of the evil one.

Neither do we need to fret about the future, or despair over purpose. The empty tomb is a sure and certain promise of what is coming our way. And purpose? As we have been loved, so we are called to love. As we have been served, so are we called to serve. As we have been given life, in all abundance, so are we to share the gift.



I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.
