SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER May 9th, 2021 ♣ 10:15 a.m.

This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's Gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

*THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Nicolaus Ludwig von Zinzendorf, renewer of the church, hymnwriter, died 1760 Sunday, May 9th

When he was 22, a group of Moravians asked permission to live on Zinzendorf's land. He agreed, and eventually worldwide Moravian missions emanated from this community. Zinzendorf participated in these missions, and is also remembered for writing hymns characteristic of his Pietistic faith.

Matthias, Apostle

Friday, May 14th

Matthias was the apostle added to the Twelve after Jesus' resurrection, as a replacement for the dead Judas Iscariot. He had traveled among the followers of Jesus throughout the Lord's ministry. Formerly commemorated on February 24th, Matthias's celebration is moved to May 14th in agreement with most Western calendars.
