FIRST READING

Isaiah 61:7-11

The prophet proclaims a hopeful message: God loves justice and will make an everlasting covenant with Israel and her descendants. In response, the prophet sings a joyful song, like Mary many generations later, about God's mercy and salvation.

In the promise of the Incarnation, Jesus Christ embodies God's mother-father heart, in love claiming people as adopted children.

*GOSPEL READING

Luke 1:46-55

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke... **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Mary's song, the Magnificat, serves as a thematic anthem for God's work in the world and therefore for the ministry of her son, Jesus. In Mary's praise we hear of a saving God who remembers the humble, scatters the proud, lifts up the lowly, and fulfills all things.

SERMON

*CREED

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

*PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Rooted in Christ and sustained by the Holy Spirit, we offer our prayers for the church, the world, and all of creation. *A brief silence is observed.*

You have revealed your love for people overlooked and cast aside, sending your son to be born among the humble and poor. Send your church to proclaim good news to those who feel abandoned, despised, or rejected and make our congregations places of genuine welcome and hospitality. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

All creation longs for healing and restoration. Restrain the destruction of plant and animal habitats and amplify the voices of those who advocate for wise stewardship of the earth's resources. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We remember your promise to our ancestors and look to you for justice. Expose pride, greed, and exploitation wherever it is found and raise up humble leaders who act on behalf of those who are poor, oppressed, or in other need. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Your Spirit lives in our hearts and makes us heirs of salvation. Rescue us from shame and dishonor. Lift up the lowly, fill the hungry with good things, and have mercy on those who turn to you for help, especially... Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Mary's song of praise and amazement echoes through this assembly. Attend to those in this congregation expecting a child and console those struggling to conceive. Come to the aid of those enduring a difficult pregnancy and those who have experienced a miscarriage. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Here other intercessions may be offered in speech and silence.

We give thanks for the saints who have found refuge in you, O Lord, especially Mary, mother of our Lord, and others whom we name... As you have delivered them from all their afflictions, so save us from all our earthly troubles until that day when we sing your praise together in heaven. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We lift these and all our prayers to you, O Lord, confident in the promise of your saving love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The peace of the Lord be with you always. **And also with you.**

MEAL

God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.

Bernard, a Cistercian monk, was a man of great spirituality who wrote mystical works and criticized those whom he thought took an overly intellectual approach to the faith. He became an abbot, and wrote several hymns that are still beloved today.
