FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT December 19th, 2021 ♣ 10:15 a.m.

Cradle and cross are inextricably connected on the Fourth Sunday of Advent. Between a lovely tribute to the little town of Bethlehem and Mary's magnificent song of praise, the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us in no uncertain terms that Christ's advent is for "the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." It is the kind of tension in which the church always lives as when in Holy Communion—with high delight—"we proclaim the Lord's death."

The prophet Micah, having pronounced judgment upon Judah, speaks of a future shepherd-king who, like David, will come from the small town of Bethlehem. This king will restore Israel and bring peace. New Testament writers understood this passage to be referring to Jesus.

Luke 1:46b-55

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

for you, Lord, have looked with favor on your lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed:

you, the Almighty, have done great things for me and holy is your name.

You have mercy on those who fear you, from generation to generation.

You have shown strength with your arm and scattered the proud in their conceit,

casting down the mighty from their thrones and lifting up the lowly.

You have filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty.

You have come to the aid of your servant Israel, to remember the promise of mercy,

the promise made to our forebears,
to Abraham and his children forever.

Hebrews 10:5-10

The author of Hebrews uses the image of religious sacrifice to convey the significance of Christ's coming. Through obedient acceptance of God's will, Christ allows his own body to become the greatest sacrifice of all, one through which we are made a holy people.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And also with you.




MEAL


