SERMON

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And also with you.


# **MEAL**




#### \*PREFACE

Massie L. Kennard, renewer of the church, died 1996 (TFF) Monday, October 10<sup>th</sup>

A native of Chicago, Kennard was a major figure in supporting and working toward ethnic and racial inclusiveness in the former Lutheran Church in America. Ordained in 1958, he served in positions including Director for Minority Concerns of the Division for Mission in North America.

*Teresa of Avila, teacher, renewer of the church, died 1582 Saturday, October 15<sup>th</sup>* 

A mystical writer and reformer of the monastic order (Carmelites) to which she belonged, Teresa may also be commemorated with John of the Cross on December 14<sup>th</sup>. Latino Christians traditionally remember her on this date.
