FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT November 27th, 2022 **◆** 10:15 a.m.

In today's readings both Paul and Jesus challenge us to wake from sleep, for we know neither the day nor hour of the Lord's coming. Isaiah proclaims the day when God will gather all people on the holy mountain and there will be no more war or suffering. Though we vigilantly watch for the promised day of salvation, we wait for what we already have: Christ comes among us this day as the Word and Meal that strengthens our faith in the promises of God.

We lift them to the Lord.



KEEP AWAKE

Days are getting shorter; nights, ever longer. It seems like an appropriate season to fall asleep. It can be difficult, after all, to work in the dark, to plan in the dark, even to hope in the dark. All the more reason to curl up with a good book or television show and let the comfort of sleep take over. All the more reason to forget the cares and concerns of life and, if possible, just let oneself drift off.

But we are called in this day, as much as in any other, to "Keep awake" (Matthew 24:42). Even in these shortened days, there might be something new coming just over the horizon. Something spectacular. Something the eye may not believe it is seeing, the ear may not believe it is hearing. Something we will not want to miss, for being asleep.

"Keep awake!" Jesus cries. He is coming again, just when we least expect him to return. For sure, no one knows the day and hour, but return he will, right in the midst of ordinary life. Right in the midst of working and preparing meals. Right in the midst of taking care of children and tending to bills. Right in the midst of driving the car, taking the transit. Possibly, right in the midst of lengthening nights.

"Keep awake!" We're going to want to see this one who comes with healing on his wings, who comes to forgive and to redeem. We are going to want to see this one, the resurrection, the life, the beginning of all things and their end. We're going to want to see him and be a part of his love, his mercy, his grace.

Days are shorter; Advent is here. Far from drifting, it's time to focus. How shall we make our lives ready for the coming king?
